














Setting up your karaoke system

Connecting the power cord

To connect the power cord:

 Plug the small connector on the AC/DC power adapter into the DC IN jack on the back of your karaoke system, then plug the other connector into a power outlet.

Connecting an external audio input device

You can connect an external audio input device to play the audio from the device through your karaoke system.

To connect an external audio input device:

- 1 Connect an audio cable to the LINE IN jack on the front of your karaoke system and to the LINE OUT jack on the external device.
- 2 Press DVD/LINE IN to select the LINE IN mode.

Playing the audio through a digital coaxial sound system

You can connect a digital coaxial sound system. When you connect a sound system, the audio from your karaoke system plays through the sound system.

To play the audio through a digital coaxial sound system:

- Connect a digital coaxial cable to the COAXIAL jack on the back of your karaoke system and to the COAXIAL IN jack on the sound system.
- 2 Select the correct audio output mode. For more information, see "Selecting the audio output mode for a connected sound system" on page 18.

























Playing the audio through an analog sound system

You can connect the included analog sound system. When you connect a sound system, the audio from your karaoke system plays through the sound system.

To play the audio through an analog sound system:

- 1 Connect an audio cable with RCA connectors to the AUDIO OUT L/R jacks on the back of your karaoke system and to the AUDIO IN L/R jacks on the sound system.
- 2 Select the correct audio output mode. For more information, see "Selecting the audio output mode for a connected sound system" on page 18.

Playing the video through an S-Video display device

You can connect an S-Video display device, such as a TV. When you connect a display device, the image on your karaoke's screen is sent to the display device.

To play the video through an external S-Video display device:

- 1 Connect an S-Video cable to the S-VIDEO jack on the back of your karaoke system and to the S-VIDEO IN jack on the S-Video device.
- 2 On the display device, set the video input to S-Video.

Playing the video through an AV display device

You can connect an AV display device, such as a TV. When you connect a display device, the image on your karaoke's screen is sent to the display device.

To play the video through an external AV display device:

- 1 Connect the included standard AV video cable to the VIDEO OUT jack on the back of your karaoke system and to the VIDEO IN jack on the display device.
- **2** On the display device, set the video input to the correct setting.

Using your karaoke system

Turning your karaoke system on or off

To turn your karaoke system on or off:

- Press ♥ the front of your karaoke system.
- Press again to turn off your karaoke system.




















Turning the screen on or off

To turn the screen on or off:

• Press **SCREEN ON/OFF** on the front of your karaoke system.

Turning the screen saver on or off

To turn the screen saver on or off:

- 1 Press **SETUP**. The on-screen menu opens.
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight ■. The SYSTEM SETUP menu opens.





- **4** Press **△** or **▼** to highlight **ON** or **OFF**, then press **ENTER** to confirm your selection.
- **5** Press **◄** to return to the previous screen, or press **SETUP** to close the menu.

Adjusting the volume


To adjust the volume:

- Rotate the **MIC VOLUME** knob on the front of your karaoke system to adjust the microphone volume.
- Rotate the **MASTER VOLUME** knob on the front of your karaoke system to adjust the master volume.
- Press **MUTE** on the remote control to mute the sound. Press again to restore the sound.

Adjusting the balance between the left and right speakers

To adjust the balance between the left and right speakers:

Rotate the BALANCE knob.

























Selecting the equalizer mode

To select the equalizer mode:

 Press EQ repeatedly. You can select Standard, Classic, Rock, Jazz or POP.

Adjusting the echo effect

To adjust the echo effect:

• While you are singing into the microphone, rotate the **ECHO** knob.

Selecting the audio source

To select the audio source:

- 1 Insert a disc, USB flash drive, or SD memory card.
- 2 Press **DVD/USB/SD**. The media list opens.



3 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **DISC**, **USB**, or **CARD**, then press **ENTER**. If you do not have a media source inserted and you select that audio source, your karaoke system will go to a media source that is inserted. For example, if you have a disc inserted but do not have a USB flash drive inserted and you select USB, your karaoke system will automatically select **DISC**.



















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Selecting the audio output mode for the internal speakers



To adjust the audio output mode for the internal speakers:


- 1 Press **SETUP**. The on-screen menu opens.
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight ▶ . The DIGITAL SETUP menu opens.







- **STEREO**—Select this setting to send a different audio to each speaker. The audio must be in stereo format.
- MONO L—Select this setting to send the audio to the left speaker only.
- MONO R—Select this setting to send the audio to the right speaker only.
- **MIX MONO**—Select this setting to send the same audio to both the left and right speakers.
- **5** Press **ENTER** to confirm your selection.
- **6** Press **◄** to return to the previous screen, or press **SETUP** to close the menu.


















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Selecting the audio output mode for a connected sound system

To select the audio output mode for a connected sound system:

- 1 Press **SETUP**. The on-screen menu opens.
- **2** Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to highlight \mathcal{J} . The AUDIO SETUP menu opens.



- **3** Press ▼ to highlight **AUDIO OUT**, then press ▶ to access the settings.
- **4** Press **△** or **▼** to select the audio output mode. You can select:
 - **SPDIF/OFF**—Select this setting if you do not have a sound system connected or if you connected a sound system to the **AUDIO OUT L/R** jacks.
 - **SPDIF/RAW**—Select this setting if you connected a sound system to the COAXIAL jack. The audio is played in it's original format.
 - **SPDIF/PCM**—Select this setting if you connected a sound system to the **COAXIAL** jack. The audio is converted to 2-channel stereo.
- **5** Press **ENTER** to confirm your selection.
- **6** Press **◄** to return to the previous screen, or press **SETUP** to close the menu.

Playing a disc

Your karaoke system plays DVDs with a region code of 1. Look for less on the disc or disc packaging.

To play a disc:

- 1 Lift the **OPEN** tab on the top of your karaoke system to open the disc compartment.
- **2** Place a disc in the tray, then close the compartment cover.
- 3 Make sure that **DISC** is selected as the audio source. See "Selecting the audio source" on page 16.


























4 Press **PLAY/PAUSE** ► II to start playback.

Playing from a USB flash drive

To play from a USB flash drive:

- 1 Insert a USB flash drive into the **USB** port on the front of your karaoke
- 2 Make sure that **USB** is selected as the audio source. See "Selecting the audio source" on page 16.
- 3 Press PLAY/PAUSE ► to start playback.

Playing from an SD memory card

To play from an SD memory card:

- 1 Insert an SD memory card into the **SD** card slot on the front of your karaoke system.
- 2 Make sure that **CARD** is selected as the audio source. See "Selecting the audio source" on page 16.
- 3 Press PLAY/PAUSE ▶II to start playback.

Controlling playback

To control playback:


- Press **PLAY/PAUSE** ▶ I to pause playback, then press again to resume playback.
- Press **STOP** to stop playback. If you press this button once, then press **PLAY/PAUSE** ▶**II**, playback resumes where you stopped. If you press this button twice, then press **PLAY/PAUSE** ▶**II**, playback resumes at the beginning of the disc.
- Press **REV** ◀ or **FWD** ▶ fast reverse or fast forward.
- Press **PREV ⋈** or **NEXT ⋈** to go to the previous or next track, chapter, or MP3 file.

Recording audio

You can record the audio and singer's voice to a USB flash drive or SD memory card. The recording will be in MP3 format. The file name for the recording will be "Track XX.mp3."

To record audio:

- While playing a CD or a disc with MP3 files, press **RECORD** to record the audio and singer's voice to a USB flash drive or SD memory card.
- To stop recording, press **RECORD** again.


























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Displaying playback information

Playback information includes:

- Media type and track number of the file that is playing
- Elapsed time
- Speaker status (on or off)
- Repeat status

To display playback information:

- Press OSD.
- Press **OSD** again to close the display.

Changing the audio tone

You can adjust the audio tone (pitch) of the voice and music.

To change the audio tone:

- During playback, press **KEY+** or **KEY-** to change the tone.
- Press FLAT to resume normal tone.

Changing acoustic channels (CD types)

You can select the acoustic channel depending on whether you are playing a CD or CD+G.

This feature only works with CDs and CD+Gs.

To change acoustic channels:

• During playback, press L/R.

Selecting a chapter, track, or starting time

To select a chapter, track, or starting time:

- 1 During disc playback, press **GOTO**. A bar with a highlight is displayed.

Press ◀ or ▶ to move to the time item, press the number buttons to enter the starting time you want, then press **ENTER**.

Selecting a track with the number buttons

To select a track with the number buttons:

• During playback, press the number buttons for the track you want to play. For example, to play track 7, press **7**. To play track 11, press **1**.























Repeating a chapter, title, or track

- To repeat a chapter, title, or track: • During playback, press **REPEAT**.
 - For discs, you can select **repeat chapter**, **repeat title**, **repeat** all, or repeat off.
 - For a USB flash drive or an SD memory card, you can select repeat track, repeat directory, repeat all, or repeat off.
- To return to normal playback, press **REPEAT** until **repeat off** appears on the display.

Creating a playback loop


To create a playback loop:

- 1 During playback, find the place where you want the loop to start, then press **A-B**.
- 2 Play the file until you come to the place where you want the loop to stop, then press **A-B**. Your karaoke system will play the loop continuously.
- To cancel the playback look and resume normal playback, press **A-B** twice.

Creating a playback program

To create a playback program:

1 During playback, press **PROG**. One of the following screens opens: DVD





























MP3/WMA/CD/JPEG



- 2 Use the arrow buttons and number buttons to enter title/folder number and chapter/track number of the chapter/track you want to play.
- **3** Repeat Step 2 to enter additional selections. A program can have as many as 16 selections.
- 4 When you have finished creating your program, highlight **PLAY**, then press **ENTER**. The selections you made are played in the order you entered them.
- 5 If you want to change a selection, press **PROG**, highlight the selection, then enter a new selection. Highlight **PLAY**, then press **ENTER**.
- 6 To clear all the selections from the program, press PROG, highlight CLEAR, then press ENTER.

Selecting a DVD title and chapter with the title menu

To select a DVD title and chapter with the title menu:

- 1 During DVD playback, press **TOP MENU** to display the title list.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the title you want to play, then ◀ or ▶ to move to the chapter list.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the chapter you want to play, then press ENTER.

Selecting a DVD chapter with the main menu

To select a DVD chapter with the main menu:

- 1 During disc playback, press **MENU**. The main menu opens with a list of chapters. The currently playing chapter is highlighted.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the chapter you want to play, then press ENTER.



















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Adjusting video settings

To adjust video settings:

- 1 Press **SETUP**. The on-screen menu opens.
- **2** Press **◄** or **▶** to highlight **②**. The *VIDEO SETUP* menu opens.




- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight an option, then press ▶ to access the settings. You can select:
 - **BRIGHTNESS**—Adjusts the brightness of dark areas of the picture.
 - **CONTRAST**—Adjusts the white level of the picture.
 - **HUE**—Adjusts the color.
 - SATURATION—Adjusts the color intensity.
- **4** Press **△** or **▼** to adjust the setting, then press **ENTER** to confirm.
- **5** Press **◄** to return to the previous screen, or press **SETUP** to close the menu.

Selecting a DVD viewing angle

Some DVDs have scenes recorded from different viewing angles.

To select a DVD viewing angle:

 Press ANGLE one or more times. The viewing angle will change if multiple viewing angles are available.
















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Selecting the aspect ratio



To select the aspect ratio:

- 1 Press **SETUP**. The on-screen menu opens.



- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **TV TYPE**, then press ▶ to access the settings.
- **4** Press **△** or **▼** to highlight an aspect ratio. You can select:
 - **4:3 PS**—Select this option if you have connected a TV or monitor with a 4:3 aspect ratio. When playing video or pictures with a 16:9 aspect ratio, the left and right parts of video or picture are cut off.
 - 4:3 LB—Select this option if you have connected a TV or monitor with a 4:3 aspect ratio. When playing video or pictures with a 16:9 aspect ratio, the full image is displayed. Black bars appear at the top and bottom of the image.
 - **16:9**—Select this option if you have connected a TV or monitor with a 16:9 wide screen aspect ratio.
- **5** Press **ENTER** to confirm your selection.
- Press ◀ to return to the previous screen, or press **SETUP** to close the menu.

Zooming in on a video image or photo

To zoom in on a video image or photo:

- Press **ZOOM**.
- Press **ZOOM** again to return to normal viewing





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Viewing a video frame by frame

To view a video frame by frame:

- During video playback, press STEP. Each time you press STEP, the video advances one frame.
- Press PLAY/PAUSE ►II to resume normal playback.

Viewing a video in slow motion

To view a video in slow motion:

- Press SLOW. Each time you press SLOW, the speed changes.
- Press **PLAY/PAUSE** ▶ II to resume normal playback.


Selecting languages on DVDs

Some DVDs have multiple language for:

- Audio
- Subtitles
- Menus

To select languages on DVDs:

- Press **SETUP**. The on-screen menu opens.
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight ♣ The LANGUAGE SETUP menu opens.



- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight a language option, then press ▶ to access the settings. You can select:
 - **AUDIO LANG**—Selects the language you hear when playing a DVD. You can also press **AUDIO** to select the audio language.
 - **SUBTITLE LANG**—Selects the language you see in subtitles. You can also press **SUBTITLE** to select the subtitle language.
 - **MENU LANG**—Selects the language for the on-screen menus.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to select an language. The available languages depend on the DVD.





















- **5** Press **ENTER** to confirm your selection.
- **6** Press **◄** to return to the previous screen, or press **SETUP** to close the menu.



To select the on-screen menu language:

- 1 Press **SETUP**. The on-screen menu opens.

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

Changing the DVD parental control password


Setting DVD parental controls




Note














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Resetting all settings to the factory defaults

To view JPEGs:


- 1 Insert a disc, USB flash drive, or SD memory card that contains JPEG

- **5** To control playback:
 - Press ▲ or ▼ to select a JPEGs file, then press **ENTER** to confirm the selected file.
 - Press **PLAY/PAUSE** ► II to play or pause.
 - Press \blacktriangle , \blacktriangledown , \triangleleft , or \blacktriangleright on the remote control to rotate an image.
 - Press **ZOOM** to enlarge an image.























Troubleshooting

DVD	
No picture	The region number of the DVD does not match the region number of your karaoke system. Your karaoke system plays DVDs with a region code of 1 or All. Make sure that you have selected to the corrected AV input for your TV. See the documentation that came with your TV.
No sound	 Make sure that audio jacks are securely connected. See "Playing the audio through a digital coaxial sound system" on page 13 or "Playing the audio through an analog sound system" on page 14. Make sure that volume is turned up. Make sure that you have selected to the corrected AV input for your TV. See the documentation that came with your TV. Your karaoke system is muted.
The picture is not clear or jumpy	 Clean the disc. See "Cleaning discs" on page 33. The disc is scratched. Try another disc.

Maintaining

Storing discs

- Do not store discs in a place that is exposed to direct sunlight or heat.
- Do not store discs in a place that is exposed to moisture and dust, such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in their cases. Stacking discs or placing objects on discs when not in their cases may cause warping.

Handling discs

- To keep a disc clean, do not touch the play side (non-label side) of the

Glossary of karaoke terms

Echo

Adds depth and resonance to a singer's voice without affecting the music. The echo effect is produced by creating minor controlled feed-back in the singer's voice.

Multiplex

Some multiplex CD+Gs have two versions of a song. One version is a stereo recording without the lead singer. The other version is recorded with music and background vocals on the left channel and the lead singer recorded on the right channel. The "split-track" recording lets you control the volume of the lead singer by rotation the **BALANCE** knob. You can sing a duet with the lead singer or use the lead singer as a guide while you learn the song, gradually fading out the lead singer voice until you can sing the song alone.

Auto Voice Control (AVC)

When AVC is activated, the vocals on a multiplex CD stop playing when a singer begins singing through the microphone. When the singer stops singing, the vocals on the CD start playing again. This feature only works with multiplex CDs.

CD+G

Stands for "Compact Disc plus Graphics." A CD+G has a video track that displays the song lyrics in sync with the music. The lyrics usually change color as when they are to be sung.











