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## **PRECAUTIONS**

#### **GENERAL PRECAUTIONS**

When installing the equipment ensure that:

- the ventilation holes are not covered.
- air is allowed to circulate freely around the equipment.
- it is placed on a vibration free surface.
- it will not be exposed to excessive heat, cold, moisture or dust.
- it will not be exposed to direct sunlight.
- it will not be exposed to electrostatic discharges.
- it is not installed vertically or tilted.

In addition, never place heavy objects on the equipment.

If a foreign object or water does enter the equipment, contact your nearest dealer or service center.

It is advisable when leaving the house, or during a thunderstorm, to disconnect the equipment from the mains supply.

#### **WARNINGS**

TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE OR ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS APPLIANCE TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.

Do not remove the cover from the equipment. There are no user serviceable parts inside, and opening the case will invalidate your warranty.

Allow adequate ventilation. Leave a gap of 0.1m on all sides of the unit.

Do not splash or spill water on the unit. Do not place objects filled with liquid (such as vases) on the unit.

Always disconnect the mains lead before moving the equipment.

**CAUTION**: This product contains a lithium battery. Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by Imerge. Dispose of batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.

#### **CD HANDLING PRECAUTIONS**

- Handle discs carefully so as not to damage or scratch the front side. Always keep the disc surface clean.
- To protect the disc avoid placing it in the following locations:
  - In direct sunlight or near a source of heat like a heater.
  - In a place which is damp or dirty.
  - In a place which could be exposed to rain, such as near a window.
- Do not use a disc with a special shape
- For best performance when recording from a CD try to maintain a temperature of 35°C or less in the room where the Audio Server is located.

#### **DTS Encoded Discs**

**CAUTION** - when playing DTS encoded CDs excessive noise will be heard on the analog outputs jacks of the Audio Server. To avoid possible damage to the audio system you should ensure that the correct connections are made to your amplification system for replaying this type of disc.

#### **MAINS PRECAUTIONS**

Your Audio Server complies with the household power and safety requirements in your area.

#### **IMPORTANT:** (for UK version only)

This apparatus is fitted with an approved moulded 13 amp plug. To change a fuse in this type of plug proceed as follows:

- 1. Remove fuse cover and fuse.
- Fix new fuse which should be a BS1362 5A, A.S.T.A or BSI approved type.
- 3. Refit the fuse cover.

If the fitted plug is not suitable for your socket outlets, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted in its place.

If the mains plug contains a fuse, this should have a value of 5A. If a plug without a fuse is used, the fuse at the distribution board should not be greater than 5A.

**Note**: The severed plug must be destroyed to avoid a possible shock hazard should it be inserted into a 13A socket elsewhere

#### How to connect a plug

The wires in the mains lead are colored in accordance with the following code:

- The BLUE wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter "N" or colored BLACK
- The BROWN wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter "L" or colored RED.
- The GREEN/YELLOW-GREEN wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked by the letter "E" or by the safety earth symbol or colored green or green-and-yellow.

Before replacing the plug cover, make certain that the cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the lead - not simply over the three wires.





## **QUICK START GUIDE**

#### **FRONT PANEL**

The following controls are available on the front panel of your Audio Server.

- MENU button: Press this button to display the main front panel functions screen on the LCD display of your Audio Server.
- Front panel action buttons: These four buttons have assignable functions as indicated by the labels at the bottom of the LCD display. For example, in the display opposite, the Setup action button will display the Set Up options.
- Navigation buttons: Move up, down, left and right through the front panel menu system. The button in the center is used to select items.
- Transport buttons: Control the playback of music on the currently selected audio output.



Your Audio Server remote control is used to control the television user interface.

- Menu key: Displays the Main Menu on the television user interface.
- Alphanumeric keypad: Use these keys to enter text and numbers where appropriate.
- 3. Navigation keys: Move up, down, left and right through the television user interface. The ✓ Select button in the center is used to select items.
- Transport keys: Control the playback of music on the currently selected audio output. The **dOutput** key is used to change the currently selected audio output.
- Now Playing key: Displays the Now Playing screen on the television user interface.
- Library key: Displays the Library screen on the television user interface.

#### **RECORDING FROM A CD**

- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel to open the CD tray.
- Place a CD in the tray.
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button again to close the CD tray.

If possible, your Audio Server will automatically use the Gracenote Music Recognition Service to obtain information about the CD.

Using the television user interface:

- Press the 

  Menu key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys to highlight the CD Drive option and press the √ Select key.
- Press the **ORecord** key to begin the recording process

**Note**: You can listen to music in your **Library** while a CD is being recorded.

**Note**: It is also possible to record a CD using the front panel interface, refer to page 27 for details.




Fig. A - Front Panel Display




Fig. B - Remote Control

#### **PLAYING MUSIC**

 Display the Library by pressing the ♥Library key on the remote control.

The Library menu allows you to choose how you want to browse your music collection. You can browse by track, album, artist, genre, year, era or playlist.

Press the ▲ and ¥ keys to step between categories.
 For example, if you select Albums you will see an alphabetical list of your album titles.

#### To play music

- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys to highlight the item you would like to play.
- Press the > key to view the contents of the selected item.
- Press the 


  ✓ Play key to begin playback.

#### To stop play

 Press the key on the front panel or the Audio Server remote control.

#### To pause play

 Press the II key on the front panel or your Audio Server remote control.



# To skip to the next or previous track

Press the 

or 

key on the front panel or your Audio Server remote control.

#### To seek within a track

Play resumes from the new position when you release the key.

#### **ENTERING TEXT**

When text is editable using the Audio Server remote control, the text entry screen will be displayed:



#### To enter text using the alphanumeric keypad

- Use the keys on the alphanumeric keypad to enter a letter.


For example, to enter S press the 7 key four times, because S is the fourth letter on the 7 key.

- Press the DELETE key on your Audio Server remote control to delete characters.
- Press the Page +/- key to toggle the character set and switch between upper-case and lower-case letters

#### **CONNECTING TO THE INTERNET**

- Press the **■Menu** key on your Audio Server remote control
- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys to highlight the Set Up option and press the √ Select key.

The Set Up menu is displayed:



 Press the ✓ Select key to open the Network Settings screen and select between Ethernet and Modem as your connection type.

#### Connecting via Ethernet

 Use the A and V keys to highlight the Network Settings option and press the ✓ Select key.

If you are using a broadband router or connecting via a home network with DHCP enabled, select **DHCP** as the mode. Otherwise select **Static** and enter your Ethernet details manually in the **IP Address**, **Subnet Mask**, **Gateway** and **DNS** fields in **Static Ethernet Settings**.

**Note**: When making changes to the **Static Ethernet Settings** it may be necessary to switch your Audio Server off and then on again in order for the changes to take effect

#### Connecting via modem

 Use the ∧ and ∨ keys to highlight the Modem Settings option and press the √ Select key.

Enter your ISP details in the **Username**, **Password** and **Telephone No.** fields.

 After all required changes have been made press the OSave key.

Your Audio Server stores and catalogs your music collection, allowing you to select any album or track at the press of a key. You can browse through your albums and tracks using convenient on-screen menus displayed on your television, showing full album, track, and artist names downloaded from the Gracenote Music Recognition Service as well as album cover art illustration from the XiVA on-line service. Your Audio Server also lets you organize your music collection and create selections for different occasions to suit your mood.

Your Audio Server is a hard disk based audio system which can store thousands of hours of music, all with the convenience of instant access, at the touch of a key.

#### Internet access for track listings



## **CONTROLS AND CONNECTIONS**

#### **FRONT VIEW**



This section provides information about the controls and connections available on your Audio Server.

#### 1 DISC TRAY

Discs should be inserted with the label side up.

#### OPEN/CLOSE button

Pressing the **OPEN/CLOSE** button opens the disc tray. Place a compact disc on the tray with the label side facing up. Press the button again to close the tray.

#### (3) OUTPUT button

Press the MENU button to display the Menu screen.

#### 4 ACTION buttons

Action buttons allow you to perform specific operations dependent on the current menu screen. For more information on using the action buttons, refer to **The Front Panel Interface** chapter on page 27.

#### (5) DISPLAY

The display shows information about the music available on the unit, the status of the Audio Server (for instance if the unit is currently playing), and the current configuration of the unit.

#### 6 SELECT button

Selects the option currently visible on the display.

#### 7 NAVIGATION buttons

The navigation buttons allow you to move up, down, left or right through the menus shown on the display.

#### (8) **■ OUTPUT button**

This button is used to select the current audio output.

#### (9) ◀◀ / ┫ button

When the button is pressed briefly during playback, play restarts at the beginning of the current track. A second brief press moves to the beginning of the previous track. When the button is held for a longer period of time the music will rewind at high speed.

## 10 **▶▶** / **▶** button

When the button is pressed briefly during playback, play restarts at the beginning of the next track. When the button is held for a longer period of time the music will fast forward at high speed.

## 11 PAUSE button

Press the pause button to interrupt playback temporarily.

## ▶ PLAY button

Press the play button to resume playback if the music has been stopped or paused.

## **13** ■ STOP button

Press the stop button to halt playback on the current audio output.

#### (14) STANDBY

Press the standby button to turn your Audio Server off, press again to switch your Audio Server back on.


## (15) REMOTE SENSOR

This window receives signals transmitted from the remote control unit.

#### (16) ONLINE

The online indicator is illuminated when the modem is active.

#### **REAR VIEW**



## 1 IR RECEIVER

The IR Receiver connection allows remote control information to be carried from other devices directly into the Audio Server

#### (2) CONTROLLER

The Controller port provides serial communication with supported devices.

#### (3) USB

Allows the Audio Server to communicate with supported USB devices.

#### (4) ETHERNET

The Ethernet port is used to connect the Audio Server to a high speed Internet connection.

#### (5) VGA

The VGA connector may be used to connect a VGA monitor or a suitable Plasma screen for displaying the TV user interface.

#### (6) MODEM

The Modem port can be used to connect the Audio Server to a standard analog telephone line for Internet access.

#### (7) VIDEO OUT

Connect the composite Video Out of the Audio Server to the composite input of a suitable PAL/NTSC TV (depending on the supplied configuration) to display the TV User Interface. You may also need to switch the TV to the relevant AUX input to display the picture.

#### (8) S-VIDEO OUT

Connect the S-VIDEO output of the Audio Server to the S-VIDEO input of a suitable PAL/NTSC TV (depending on the supplied configuration) to display the TV User Interface. You may also need to switch the TV to the relevant AUX input to display the picture.

#### 9 DIGITAL OPTICAL IN

High quality recordings can be made onto the hard disk of the Audio Server using an optical connection from a suitable device (such as Minidisc or DAT). (To be supported in future software releases).

## 10 DIGITAL OPTICAL OUT

The digital optical output can be used to transmit high quality audio to a device with a digital optical input (D/A converter, A/V amplifier etc.) using an optical fiber cable. The advantage of using the optical output is that it has low signal loss due to cables and is completely isolated from the ground loop. The audio output of the Digital Optical Out connector is the same as the audio output of the Analog Audio Out 1 connector. This output may not be used for making a digital copy of your media.

#### (11) DIGITAL IN - COAXIAL

High quality recordings can be made onto the hard disk of the Audio Server using a coaxial connection from a suitable device (such as Minidisc or DAT). (To be supported in future software releases).

#### 12 DIGITAL OUT - COAXIAL

By connecting this jack to a digital audio component (D/A converter, A/V amplifier etc.), digital signals from the Audio Server can be transmitted directly from the system without first being converted to analog. The audio output of the Digital Coaxial Out connector is the same as the audio output of the Analog Audio Out 1 connector. This output may not be used for making a digital copy of your media.

### (13) ANALOG IN

Analog sources (such as cassette or vinyl LP) may be recorded onto the hard disk of the Audio Server using this connection. (To be supported in future software releases).

## (14) ANALOG OUT 1,2,3,4


The Audio Server is a multiroom device allowing you to listen to different music in up to four different rooms all at the same time (depending on the configuration purchased). Each analog output should be connected to the input jacks of a pre-amplifier.

#### (15) MAINS

Connect the supplied mains lead to this connector to provide power to the unit.

#### REMOTE CONTROL

The following diagram explains the function of the keys on your Audio Server remote control:



## ① **STANDBY** key

Puts the television user interface of the Audio Server in to and out of Standby mode.

#### (2) AUDIO SERVER kev

Press this key to select the Audio Server as the device to be controlled. This key illuminates each time a key on the remote control is pressed.

## 3 TV key

Press this key to select the TV as the device to be controlled

## 4 HOME OUTPUT key

Press this key to select the Home Output.

## 5 AMP key

Press this key to select the Amp as the device to be controlled

## 6 PAGE SCROLL keys

These keys are used to scroll through menus by page. When editing text, these keys are used to change the character set.

## √ MUTE key

This key currently has no function.

## 8 ✓ VOLUME keys

These keys currently have no function

## A SZ ALPHABETIC SCROLL key

Press this key to access the **Intial Letter** screen. This screen is only available if the list currently displayed is in alphabetical order.

## 10 X CANCEL key

The Cancel key is used to cancel an operation which you no longer wish to continue.

## 11 **▶** LIBRARY key

The **Library** key is used to display the **Library** screen to browse your music collection.

## 12 **■ MENU key**

Press this key to display the Main Menu.

## 13 • NOW PLAYING key

The **Now Playing** key is used to view the **Now Playing** screen for the currently selected audio output.

## 14 NAVIGATION <,>,∧,∨ keys

The navigation keys are used to move up, down, left or right through the menu pages.

## 15 ✓ SELECT key

**Select** is used to activate the currently highlighted option. When browsing the **Library** this key will start playback of the selected item.

## (16) O ACTION key

The **Action** key performs different tasks depending on the screen you are currently viewing. For example, on the **Albums** screen, this key is used to add the highlighted selection to a playlist.

## ① Q SEARCH key

The **Search** key can be used to search for music in your **Library**. If pressing this key has no effect, then the search function cannot be used on the current screen.

## (18) • OPTIONS key

Press this key on any library screen to view a list of available options. If pressing this key has no effect, then there are no options available on the current screen.

## (19) < □ MARK key</p>

This key is used in the **Library** to select multiple items and then perform an action on them collectively. For more information about using the mark function refer to page 18.

## 20 NUMERIC (0 to 9) keys

The numeric keys can be used as follows:

- In the library you may jump to an item in the list that begins with one of the letters specified at the top of each key.
- In text entry mode these keys can be used as an alphanumeric key pad (similar to a mobile phone).

#### 

The Repeat key has the following functions:

- During playback this key toggles the repeat play setting on the Audio Server.
- In text entry mode this key can be used to perform a carriage return.

## ② **与 SHUFFLE (DELETE) key**

The Shuffle key has the following functions:

- During playback this key toggles the random play setting on the Audio Server.
- In text entry mode this key can be used to delete characters.

## ② ■ STOP key

During playback the **Stop** key halts playback on the currently selected output of the Audio Server.

## PLAY key

The **Play** key can be used to resume playback on the currently selected output of the Audio Server.

## ②5 **◀** OUTPUT key

Press this key to change the currently selected audio output.

## 26 **▶▶ ▶** key

When this key is pressed briefly during playback, play restarts at the beginning of the next track. When the key is held for a longer period of time the music will fast forward at high speed.

#### 

When this key is pressed briefly during playback, play restarts at the beginning of the current track. A second brief press moves to the beginning of the previous track. When the key is held for a longer period of time the music will rewind at high speed.

#### 28 II PAUSE key

Press the pause key to interrupt playback temporarily.

#### **SWITCHING ON AND OFF**

Your Audio Server is designed to remain switched on continuously. However, if you are not planning to use your Audio Server for an extended period of time, you may want to switch it off.

- To switch off, press the STANDBY button on the front panel of your Audio Server. Next, press the action button labelled Yes below the LCD display. After a brief period, the unit will switch off and the Standby LED will glow red.
- To switch back on, press the STANDBY button on the front panel of your Audio Server again. After a brief period, the unit will switch on, the Standby LED will glow green and the TV will display the Audio Library screen.

If you are not using your Audio Server for a brief period, you may want to switch it to Standby mode.

- Press the **OStandby** key on your Audio Server remote control. The TV screen will display the Standby screen.
- Press the **OStandby** key again to leave Standby mode and return to normal operation.

# CONFIGURING YOUR REMOTE TO CONTROL OTHER DEVICES

The **TV** and **Amp** keys on the remote control may be individually configured to control a range of televisions and amplifiers from well known manufacturers.

#### To configure the remote to control your television:

 Press the TV and Select keys simultaneously; hold them down for 1 second.

The TV key will remain lit for 20 seconds; the configuration process must be completed during this time

- Enter the 3 digit numeric code matching the manufacturer of your television from the list in Appendix A.
- Press the TV button again.

The TV key will blink twice to indicate that the configuration has been accepted. If the TV key does not blink begin the process again, taking care to enter the number exactly as printed in the list. If the television is switched on during the configuration process, entering the correct code will cause the television to go into standby.

To configure the remote to control your amplifier, follow the above procedure, pressing the **AMP** key in place of the **TV** key, and using the appropriate numeric code for your amplifier.

# REMOTE CONTROL USE IN A MULTIROOM SYSTEM

Your Audio Server remote control can be configured so that every button press indicates to the system which output is to be controlled. This means that whenever infrared is received by the Audio Server the TV display will automatically switch to controlling the appropriate output.

#### To configure the remote with a default output

 Press the Audio Server and ✓ Select keys simultaneously; hold them down for 1 second.

The **Audio Server** key will remain lit for 20 seconds; the configuration process must be completed during this time

- Enter the 3 digit code corresponding to the output you would like to control (valid configurations are listed in Appendix A). For example, to set output 2 as your default output press:
  - 0, 0, 2
- Press the Audio Server button again.

The Audio Server button will blink twice to indicate that the configuration has been accepted. If the Audio Server button does not blink twice begin the process again, taking care to enter the number correctly.

Pressing any navigation key on the remote should now cause the Audio Server to switch to the correct output. The remote control can still be used to control a different audio output in the normal way; pressing the Home Output key will return it to controlling the default output.

## THE MAIN MENU

The main functions of your Audio Server are accessible via the **Main Menu**. The **Main Menu** is the first screen to be displayed when your Audio Server is switched on. Alternatively, from any screen in the television user interface, you can press the **Menu** key on your Audio Server remote control and the **Main Menu** will be displayed:



The options available from the **Main Menu** are as follows:

#### Library

Select this function to display the **Library** screen. The **Library** stores all of the music you record on to the hard disk of your Audio Server.

See page 13 for information regarding the library and navigation techniques.

#### **CD Drive**

Select this function to display the **CD Drive** screen. The **CD Drive** function is used to record or play CDs from the CD tray.

See the chapter entitled **Recording Music** on page 12 for more information about the **CD Drive** screen.

#### **Now Playing**

Select this function to display the **Now Playing** screen for the currently selected audio output. You can also view this screen by pressing the **BNow Playing** key on the remote control.

The **Now Playing** screen is explained in more detail in the section entitled **Playback Information** on page 19.

#### **Play Queue**

Select the **Play Queue** option to view the library items queued to play on the currently selected audio output.

For details about using the play queue feature see the section entitled **The Play Queue** on page 21.

#### Output

Select this function to choose which of the available audio outputs you wish to control.

Changing the controlled audio output is explained in greater detail in the section called **Switching Audio Outputs** on page 20.

#### **Look Up Album Details**

Select this function to display the **Look Up Album Details** screen. If you have an Internet connection, use this function to retrieve album details from the Internet.

Refer to the section entitled **Recording Music**, which starts on page 12, for more information about this function.

#### **Remote Back Up and Restore**

Select this function to display the **Remote Back Up and Restore** screen. This function allows you to back up all of the music in your **Library** to a selected location.

The chapter explaining remote back up and restore begins on page 32.

#### **Set Up**

Select this function to display the **Set Up** screen. From here you can view and amend important settings used by your Audio Server.

For more information refer to the chapter titled **System Set Up** on page 24.

#### THE SCREENSAVER

The Audio Server is equipped with a screensaver which will activate when the unit remains idle for a specified period of time. You may choose to disable to the screen saver or alter the time delay before it activates.

**Note**: It is strongly recommended that you leave the screensaver enabled if you are using a plasma or rear projection television to display the user interface.

#### To change the screensaver settings

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to select the Set Up option.
- Press the **Select** key.
- Use the A or V keys again to select the User Interface Settings option.

The following screen is displayed:



To alter the time delay before the screensaver activates

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to select the Screensaver Delay option.
- Select an option between 5 and 60 minutes and press the Osave key.

## To disable the screensaver

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to select the Screensaver option.
- Select Disable and press the OSave key.

## RECORDING MUSIC

Your Audio Server can make new recordings onto the hard disk by recording music directly from an audio CD placed in the CD tray.

Your Audio Server can access the Internet, using either a broadband connection (via the Ethernet port) or using the built-in modem, to automatically retrieve information about the CD. This information includes the album name, artist name, track names and music genre from the Gracenote Music Recognition Service and an album cover illustration from the XiVA on-line service.

#### Recording from a CD

- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel to open the CD tray.
- Place a CD in the tray.
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel again to close the CD tray.


Your Audio Server will now automatically attempt to retrieve information about the CD from the Gracenote Music Recognition Service.

If you do not have an Internet connection, or the CD is not listed in the database, it will be given names such as Album 35, Artist 21, and Track 1, Track 2 etc. and it will be classified in genre **Unclassified**.

- Press the 

   Menu key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to select the **CD Drive** option.
- Press the ✓ Select key.

The CD Drive screen will display the contents of the CD:



Press the **©Record** key.

Depending on the configuration of your Audio Server, you may now be presented with the **Recording Quality** options. By default, the **Auto Quality** set up option is set to **enabled** and the recording quality will be determined by the **Recording Quality** set up option. If you have set the **Auto Quality** option to **disabled**, you will be asked to choose the recording quality each time you record a CD.

Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to choose either
 Uncompressed WAV, or one of the MP3 or WMA compression options.

**Note**: The higher quality options use more space on your Audio Server hard disk, so you will not be able to record as many CDs. The amount of recording time left is displayed at the bottom of the screen as you scroll the compression options when recording a CD.

Press the 

Select key to begin recording.

The **CD Recording** screen, with progress indicator will be displayed:



Once recording is complete the new album will appear in the **Library**.

Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to remove the disc.

If you have selected a recording quality using one of the MP3 or WMA compression settings, the compression process will begin immediately.

If there is no Internet connection present at the time of recording a CD, you can use **Look Up Album Details** from the **Main Menu** to retrieve any missing album details from the Internet.

- Press the 

  Menu key to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to select the Look Up Album Details option.
- Press the OStart key to begin.

#### Listening to music while recording a CD

You can play music from the **Library** while you are recording a CD.

- If you are already playing music from the Library press the Now Playing key to return to displaying information about the track you are playing.
- If you are not already playing music from the Library or wish to change the music you are listening to, press the 
  ☐Library key on the Audio Server remote control and select music as normal.

At any time you can return to see the progress of your recording by selecting **CD Drive** from the **Main Menu**.

## **Playing a CD**

Your Audio Server can play a CD directly from the CD tray without first recording it to the hard disk.

- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel to open the CD tray.
- Place a CD in the tray.
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel again to close the CD tray.
- Press the **■Menu** key on your Audio Server remote control to display the **Main Menu**.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to select the CD Drive option.
- Press the ✓ Select key.
- Press the **✓ Play** key.

**Note**: You cannot record a CD while playing from the CD trav


## PLAYING MUSIC

This chapter explains how to play music that you have recorded on to your Audio Server. It also explains how to locate the music you wish to play in a number of different ways.

#### THE LIBRARY


The television user interface has been designed to allow easy navigation through the **Library** and therefore give quick and easy access to your complete music collection in a number of different ways. Each screen in the **Library** is carefully constructed to provide the most important information about the items you are viewing.

The illustration below shows how the **Library** screens are structured and describes each part of the screen, the information displayed and the functions available. The example shows the **Tracks** screen for the album *Cold Water Songs*, however all navigation screens in the **Library** are similar in construction.



#### **LIBRARY NAVIGATION OVERVIEW**

Press the Library key on your remote control to display the Library screen. You can use your remote control to select a track directly, or follow the instructions below and navigate through the library interface to select a track.



#### PLAYING MUSIC FROM THE LIBRARY

The following sections contains a detailed explanation about selecting items in the **Library** for playback.

#### To Display the Library

#### Either:

 Press the VLibrary key on your Audio Server remote control from any screen.

#### Or:

 Use the ∧ or ∨ keys on the Main Menu to highlight the Library option and press ✓ Select.

The Library screen is displayed:



#### To browse the Library by track

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the Tracks option in the Library Menu.
- Press the > key to display the Tracks screen.

The TV screen will display the tracks in your **Library**:



- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between tracks, or press the appropriate letter on your Audio Server remote control to jump directly to that position in the list
- Alternatively, press the QSearch button to list just those tracks that contain a particular word or group of letters.

#### To play a particular track:

- Press the ✓ Play key to begin playback immediately, or press the □Add button to add this track to a playlist.
- Press the **<** key to return to the **Library**.

#### To browse the Library by album

- Use the ∧ or ∀ keys to highlight the Albums option in the Library Menu.
- Press the > key to display the Albums screen.

The TV screen will display the albums in your Library:



- Press the A or V keys to step between albums, or press the appropriate letter on your Audio Server remote control to jump directly to that position in the list
- Alternatively, press the Search button to list just those albums that contain a particular word or group of letters.

#### To play the entire album:

 Press the ✓ Play key on your Audio Server remote control to begin playback immediately, or press the
 □ Add button to add this album to the play queue.

#### To select a particular track from this album:

- Press the > key to open the album and display the tracks it contains.
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to step between tracks.
- Press the ✓ Play key to begin playback immediately, or press the ☑ Add button to add this track to a playlist.

#### To browse the Library by artist

- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to highlight the **Artists** option in the **Library** Menu.
- Press the > key to display the Artists screen.

The TV screen will display the artists in your Library:



 Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between artists, or press the appropriate letter on your Audio Server remote control to jump directly to that position in the list.  Alternatively, press the QSearch button to list just those artists that contain a particular word or group of letters.

#### To play all albums by the selected artist:

#### To select a particular album by the selected artist:

- Press the > key to display all available albums by the selected artist.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between albums.

#### Either:

 Press the ✓Play key to begin playback immediately, or press the □Add button to add this album to a playlist.

#### Or:

 Press the ➤ key again to select a track from within the album.

#### Or:

Press the 
 key to return to browsing by artists.

#### To browse the Library by genre

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the Genres option in the Library Menu.
- Press the > key to display the Genres screen.

The TV screen will display the genres in your Library:



- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between genres.
- Alternatively, press the Q Search button to list just those genres that contain a particular word or group of letters.

#### To play all albums in the selected genre:

 Press the ✓ Play key on your Audio Server remote control to begin playback immediately, or press the ②Add button to add all albums in the selected genre to a playlist.

## To select a particular album in the selected genre:

- Press the > key to display all artists within the selected genre.
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to step between artists.
- Press the > key again to display all albums by a particular artist.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between albums.

#### Either:

 Press the ✓Play key to begin playback immediately, or press the ☑Add button to add this album to a playlist.

#### Or:

#### To browse the Library by Year

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the Years option in the Library Menu.
- Press the > key to display the Years screen.

The TV screen will display the years available in your Library:



 Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between years, or press the appropriate key on the alphanumeric keypad to jump directly to that position in the list.

## To play all albums in the selected year:

 Press the ✓ Play key on your Audio Server remote control to begin playback immediately, or press the □ Add button to add all albums in the selected year to a playlist.

### To select a particular album in the selected year:

- Press the > key to display all albums within the selected year.
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to step between albums.

#### Fither

 Press the ✓ Play key to begin playback immediately, or press the OAdd button to add this album to a playlist.

#### Or:

• Press the **≺** key to return to browsing by years.

#### To browse the Library by Era

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the Eras option in the Library Menu.
- Press the > key to display the Eras screen.

The TV screen will display the eras in your Library:



 Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between eras, or press the appropriate key on the alphanumeric keypad to jump directly to that position in the list.

#### To play all albums in the selected era:

 Press the ✓ Play key on your Audio Server remote control to begin playback immediately, or press the □ Add button to add all albums in the selected era to a playlist.

#### To select a particular album in the selected era:

- Press the > key to display all albums within the selected era
- Use the  $lack \Lambda$  or lack V keys to step between albums.

#### Either:

 Press the ✓Play key to begin playback immediately, or press the □Add button to add this album to a playlist.

#### Or:

#### To browse Playlists in the Library

Playlists allow you to create your own selections of tracks and save them with a name of your choice such as *Party Music*. For more information about creating a playlist refer to **Creating a new Playlist** on page 21.

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the Playlists option in the Library Menu.
- Press the > key to display the Playlists screen.

The TV screen will display the playlists in your Library:



**Note**: If you have not yet created any playlists the list will be empty.

- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between playlists, or press the appropriate letter on your Audio Server remote control to jump directly to the item in the list beginning with that letter.
- Alternatively, press the Q Search button to list just those playlists that contain a particular word or group of letters.
- Press the ✓ Play key on your Audio Server remote control to begin playback immediately, or press the OAdd button to add all tracks in the selected playlist to another playlist.

# Selecting items directly using your Audio Server remote control.

You can select an item from your library directly by the first letter of its title using the alphanumeric keypad on your Audio Server remote control.

#### To select a library item by name:

- Display the appropriate library menu for the item you want to find (e.g. Artists).
- Press the alphanumeric keypad key corresponding to the first letter of the item you want to select.

For example to find the artist Santessa navigate to the **Artists** screen, then press the **7** key four times because S is the fourth letter on the **7** key. The TV screen shows the first artist beginning with the letter S.

If there are several artists beginning with the letter S press the  $\bigvee$  key to step through until you find the artist for which you are looking.

• Press the 1 key to return to the top of the list.

Alternatively, you can use the Az function to select a library item by initial letter:

- Display the appropriate library menu for the item you want to find (e.g. **Artists**).
- Press the Atz key on your Audio Server remote control.

The TV screen displays a list of letters which correspond to the starting letter of the items available in the chosen list:



- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between the letters in the list and highlight the starting letter of the item you are trying to locate.
- Press the **Select** key.

The TV screen will display the first artist beginning with the letter S.


If there are several artists beginning with the letter S press the  $\bigvee$  key to step through until you find the artist for which you are looking.

• Press the 1 key to return to the top of the list.

#### THE SEARCH FUNCTION

The search function can be used from any **Library** screen to reduce the items in the current list to only those that contain a particular word or collection of characters.

To use the search function, navigate to the list in the library you wish to search and press the  $\bigcirc$  Search key on your Audio Server remote control. The below screen is displayed. Use the alphanumeric keypad to enter text and press the  $\checkmark$  OK key. A list of items containing your search criteria will then be displayed.



#### THE MARK FUNCTION


The mark function can be used to select multiple items within a list in the **Library**. You can then perform a single action on all the marked items rather than going through them one by one.

For example:

#### To delete multiple albums from the Library

- Press the ►Library key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Library.
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight Albums and press the ✓ Select key to display the Albums list.
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys again to highlight an album you wish to delete.
- Press the ¬Mark key.

The mark symbol will appear next to the marked album:



Place a mark symbol next to the other albums you wish to delete.

- Press the **Options** key and highlight **Delete** marked albums.
- Press the **Select** key.

If there are less than one hundred items in a list, you also have the option to mark all of the items in a list, without having to go through them individually.

For example:

#### To delete all the albums by a particular artist

- Press the 

  Browse key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Library.
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight Artists and press the ✓ Select key to display the Artists list.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys again to highlight an artist and press the > key.


A list of all the albums by the chosen artist is displayed.

- Press the **Options** key and choose **Mark all**.
- Press the **Select** key.
- Press the **Options** key again and choose **Delete** marked albums.
- Press the **✓ Select** key.


**Note**: If pressing the **¬Mark** key has no effect, then the mark function is not available on the current screen.

## PLAYBACK INFORMATION

The illustration below shows the **Now Playing** screen. Whenever you select an item in the **Library** for playback, this screen is displayed. You can also choose to display this screen at any time by pressing the **Mow Playing** key on your Audio Server remote control. When you make this selection, your Audio Server will display the **Now Playing** screen for the currently selected audio output. If your Audio Server has multiple audio outputs, you will also have multiple **Now Playing** screens which are selectable using the **Qutput** key on your Audio Server remote control (refer to page 20 for more information).



This part of the screen displays information about the currently playing selection.



#### SWITCHING AUDIO OUTPUTS

Your Audio Server is capable of playing different music in several rooms simultaneously. If you wish to play music in a particular room, you must first choose the correct audio output.

#### To select an Audio Output

 Press the **\(\bigsq\)Output** key on your Audio Server remote control.

The following screen is displayed:



- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to select an audio output.
- Press the **✓ Select** key.

You are now in control of the audio output you have selected and items you select for playback in the **Library** will play on this audio output.

You can view the playback status of the currently selected output at any time by pressing the **\overline{O}Now**Playing key on your Audio Server remote control.

#### **CONTROLLING PLAYBACK**

Whether you are playing music from the **Library** or directly from the CD you can pause, stop and resume playback as well as seek and skip tracks at any time.

#### To pause play

 Press the le key on the front panel or your Audio Server remote control.

#### To stop play

 Press the key on the front panel or your Audio Server remote control.

#### To resume play

 Press the ► key on the front panel or your Audio Server remote control.

#### To skip to the next or previous track

 Press the ◀◀ ◄ or ▶ ▶ key on the front panel or your Audio Server remote control.

The front panel display shows the number of each track as you skip between them.

#### To seek within a track

 Hold down the ◀◀ ◄ or ▶ ▶ key on the front panel or your Audio Server remote control.

Play resumes from the new position when you release the key.

#### Shuffle and repeat playback

Your Audio Server lets you play selections from the **Library** in a shuffled order to add variety to your music. You can also play selections repeatedly.

#### To shuffle the playback order

- Press the key on your Audio Server remote control to randomize the order of the selections in the play queue.
- Press the key a second time to shuffle all of the tracks in the play queue. This will also turn on repeat mode for continuous playback of all tracks.
- Press the \(\frac{1}{2}\) key a third time to disable shuffle.

## To repeat the current selection

- Press the key on your Audio Server remote control to repeat the currently playing track.
- Press the **Q** key a second time to repeat the entire play queue.
- Press the **Q** key a third time to disable repeat.

The front panel and TV screen both indicate that shuffle and repeat are enabled.

#### **NOW PLAYING SCREEN OPTIONS**

There are a number of options available from the **Now Playing** screen.

- Press the Now Playing key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Now Playing screen.

The following screen is displayed:



#### Jump to album

- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to select **Jump to album**.
- Press the ✓ Select key.

The currently playing album will be displayed.

#### Jump to artist

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to select Jump to artist.
- Press the ✓ Select key.

All albums by the currently playing artist will be displayed.

#### Jump to genre

- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to select **Jump to genre**.
- Press the ✓ Select key.

All artists in the same genre as the currently playing track will be displayed.

From this options screen, you also have the choice to edit album or track details. For instructions regarding the use of these options, refer to the **Editing the Library** chapter on page 22.

#### THE PLAY QUEUE

Any item in your **Library** can be selected for playback in one of two ways:

- Press the ✓ Play key to begin playback immediately, ending playback of any current music selection.
- Press the **O**Add key and select the [Play Queue] option to add the selected item to the end of the play queue. For example, if you are currently playing an album, the item you have selected will not begin playing until the album has finished.

Any item in the **Library** can be added to the play queue, from an individual track to an entire genre.

#### To display the play queue:

- Press the > key to display the play queue.



#### To remove a selection from the play queue

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the selection you would like to remove from the queue.
- Press the **Options** key and chose **Delete Selection** from the list.

#### To clear the play queue

- Press the **Options** key and choose **Mark all**.
- Press the **Options** key again and choose **Delete** marked selections.

#### To move a selection in the play queue

- Use the ¬Mark key to mark the selection(s) you wish to move.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the selection after which you wish to place the marked selections.

#### To save a play queue as a playlist

You can save a play queue as a playlist so that you can listen to the same collection of music at a later time.

- From the Play Queue screen press the OSave key on your audio server remote control.
- In the screen that appears, enter a name for the play list using the alphanumeric keypad.
- Press the **✓ Save** key.

Your current play queue will now be available as a playlist in the **Library**.

# ORGANIZING YOUR MUSIC COLLECTION

This chapter describes the features built into your Audio Server to help you organize the music in your music library, including information about creating playlists of your favorite tracks, deleting albums or tracks you no longer want to store, and naming albums, tracks, and artists

#### **PLAYLISTS**

Your Audio Server allows you to create your own selections, called playlists, and identify them with a name of your choice. For example, you could select your favorite party tracks from a number of different albums and include them in a playlist called *Party Music*. You can then play your selection simply by choosing the appropriate playlist from the **Playlist** screen.

#### Creating a new playlist

- Display the Library by pressing the ♥Library key on your Audio Server remote control.
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the Playlists option and press the √Select key.

The following screen will be displayed, listing your existing playlists:



- Press the **Options** key.
- Select New Playlist and press the Select key.
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to enter a name for the new playlist and press the Select key.

Your new playlist will now appear in the list.

#### Adding music to a playlist

You can add music from your **Library** to a playlist from any library screen, by using the **QAdd** key on your Audio Server remote control.

For example, to add an album to a playlist:

- Press the Library key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Library.
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight Albums and press the √ Select key to display the albums list.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the album you wish to add to a playlist.
- Press the **OAdd** key.

The following screen is displayed:



 Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to select the playlist to which you would like to add your chosen album.

Alternatively, use the **ONew** key to create a new playlist as described in the previous section.

Press the Select key to add the album to the playlist.

You can also use the **Mark** key to mark multiple items in the **Library** and then add them to a playlist using the above method.

#### **Editing Playlists**

#### To edit a playlist name

- From the Playlists screen, use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the playlist you wish to edit.
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to edit the playlist name and then press the OSave key.

#### To remove an item from a playlist

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the item you would like to remove from the playlist.

To delete multiple items from a playlist use the **¬Mark** key to mark the items you wish to remove and then follow the process described above.

#### To move an item in a playlist

- Use the ¬Mark key to mark the item(s) you wish to move
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the item after which you wish to place the marked items.

#### To delete a playlist

- From the Playlists screen, use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the playlist you wish to delete.

To delete multiple playlists use the ⊲Mark key to mark the playlists you wish to remove and then follow the process described above.

#### **EDITING THE LIBRARY**

Your Audio Server labels the albums, artists and tracks in your **Library** with names which identify the track you are listening to, and these help you locate items when you are browsing through the **Library**.

If you have an Internet connection, your Audio Server reads the CD information automatically from the Gracenote Music Recognition Service. You can edit these names at any stage to suit your own preferences.

#### **Editing Album Information**

- Press the ♥Library key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Library.
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to select Albums and press the > key.
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys again to highlight the album you wish to edit.

The following screen is displayed:



- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight either Name, Artists, Genres, Year or Era.
- Press the Edit key.
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to edit the text and press the ✓OK key.

When you have finished making changes to an album's details make sure you press the **OSave** key.

If, for example, multiple genres are applicable to an album these can be entered by pressing the **RETURN** key on the remote control between entries, while editing the genre field.

#### **Editing Track Information**

- Press the 

  Library key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Library.
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to select Tracks and press the > key.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys again to highlight the track you wish to edit.

The following screen is displayed:



- Use the ∧ or ∀ keys to highlight either Name, Artists, Genres, Year, Era or Artwork.
- Press the Ldit key.
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to edit the title and press the **✓OK** key.

When you have finished making changes to a track's details make sure you press the **OSave** key.

#### **Editing Genre, Year and Era names**

- Press the ♥\Library key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Library.
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to select either Genres, Years or Eras and press the > key.
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys again to highlight the genre, year or era you wish to edit.
- Press the **Options** key and choose the **Edit name** option.
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to enter a new name for the genre, year or era.

#### **Selecting Album Artwork**

Your Audio Server stores a number of generic cover art images that can be applied to albums in your **Library**. You can also choose to apply cover art that has been downloaded from the XiVA Online Service to any album in your library.

- Highlight the album in your Library to which you would like to apply a cover art image.
- Press the **Options** key.
- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys to select Edit Album Details and press the √ Select key.
- Choose the Artwork option and press the ✓Edit key.

The following screen, listing all of the cover art images stored on your Audio Server, is displayed:



- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to scroll through the cover art images.
- Press the Select key to associate a piece of artwork with your chosen album.

It is also possible to upload images from your PC to your Audio Server and apply these to albums in your **Library**. For more information, refer to the section titled **Importing Files To Your Audio Server** on page 31.

#### **Deleting albums and tracks**

- Press the ♥Library key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Library.
- Press the ∧, ¥ and ➤ keys to navigate to the album or track you would like to delete.

A confirmation screen will appear:



 Press the 
Yes key to confirm you wish to delete the album or track.

**Note**: Any items you choose to delete will be permanently erased from your Audio Server's hard disk. Anything you delete by accident will need to be re-recorded.


## SYSTEM SET UP

This chapter describes the advanced settings that you can access from your Audio Server's **Set Up** menu.

To access the **Set Up** menu:

- Use the **∧** and **∨** keys to highlight the **Set Up** option.
- Press the **Select** key.

The following screen is displayed:



The following sections describe each of the options available from the **Set Up** menu.

### **Network Settings**

This section allows you to specify how your Audio Server connects to the Internet.




Choose between **Ethernet**, **Modem** or **None** as the connection type and press the **OSave** key to commit any changes you make.

Specify **DHCP** as the **Ethernet Mode** if your Audio Server is connected to a network with a DHCP server present, and the Ethernet settings should be assigned automatically. Otherwise, choose **Static** and enter your own Ethernet details in the **Static Ethernet Settings** section.

#### **Current Ethernet Settings**


Allows you to view the current Ethernet settings being used by your Audio Server.



This menu is not editable and is used for reference only. See below for instructions about changing these settings.

#### **Static Ethernet Settings**

This section allows you to configure the Audio Server's Ethernet settings.



Use this section to enter your own Ethernet details in the IP Address, Subnet Mask, Gateway and DNS fields. Again, be sure to press the OSave key to commit any changes you make.

#### **Modem Settings**

If you select **Modem** as your **Internet Connection** type you must then input your Internet Service Provider's details on this screen.



#### TV Settings

This section is used to specify if your Audio Server is configured for PAL or NTSC use.



You may need to edit this setting if the television user interface is either not displayed on your television screen, or is displayed incorrectly.

#### **User Interface Settings**

The options on this menu allow you to change the settings that affect the way the user interface is displayed.



By default, your Audio Server wil be in **Passive** mode; changing to **Active** will add icons to the interface depicting the available options on each screen.

This screen also allows you to enable or disable the hints that appear at the bottom of some of the screens and the button pulse when an option is selected. You can also alter the delay prior to the screen saver displaying when the unit is idle.

In addition, you can also enable or disable **Auto Output**. This option dictates whether a remote control specifically programmed to control a particular audio output will automatically switch the Audio Server to control the assigned ouput when a button is pressed on the remote control. For more information about using this feature, see the section entitled **Remote Control Use in a Multimroom System** on page 10.

#### System Information

The **System Information** screen displays information about the configuration of your Audio Server, such as the serial number and the version number of the software currently running.



You may need to quote this information if you contact your dealer or installer for technical support.

On this screen there is a also a **Reset System** option available by pressing the **O** key on the remote control. Select this option and press the **reset Defaults** key to return your Audio Server to its default factory settings. You can also choose the **OClear Content** option to remove all the music from your **Audio Library**.

If you choose to clear all the content from your **Audio Library** you will be asked to enter a password to confirm your action. The password is *ResetMyMusic*.

**Note**: If you perform either of the above two actions, you will not be able to reverse their effects.

#### **Software Update Settings**

In the unlikely event that a software update attempt fails, you may need to amend these settings. If this scenario arises, contact your dealer or installer for more information.



#### **Remote Back Up Settings**

This screen allows you to specify **Username**, **Password** and **Location** for performing a Back Up operation.



For more information about the use of these settings, refer to the section titled **Remote Back Up And Restore**, on page 32.

#### **CD Record Settings**

In this screen you have the option to change the speed at which the CD drive records and also to select the default record quality setting.



Selecting **Maximum** as the **Drive Speed** will record your CDs at high speed. If you find this setting makes your Audio Server too noisy, select **Standard** for quieter but slower operation.

Choose between Uncompressed WAV, High Quality MP3 (192k VBR), Standard Quality MP3 (128k VBR), High Quality WMA (128k CBR) and Standard Quality WMA (96k CBR) as the default recording quality used by both the TV and front panel user interfaces when recording a CD.

The **Audio Quality** option allows you to specify if your Audio Server displays the **Audio Quality** options each time a CD is recorded. By default this option is **enabled**. If you prefer to select the record quality each time you record a CD, change it to **disabled**.

#### Media Transfer Settings

Here you can enable or disable the media transfer function.



#### XiVALink Settings

Your Audio Server uses a protocol called XiVALink to communicate with compatible devices and controllers.




For information about amending these settings, please contact your dealer or installer.

# THE FRONT PANEL INTERFACE

In addition to the user interface displayed on your television screen, the Audio Server also has a user interface accessible via the LCD display and buttons on the front panel of the unit. This is an abridged version of the television user interface and provides access to a limited number of controls and functions.

Press the button labelled **MENU** on the front of the unit to display the following screen on the front panel LCD display:



The labels at the bottom of the screen (Out, Albums, CD and Setup) correspond to the four action buttons below the LCD display on the front panel. The function of these buttons can change dependent on which screen is displayed on the front panel.


**Note**: The **MENU** button can be used at any time to return to the above screen.

#### To display playback information

The front panel user interface has the ability to display basic information about the status of your Audio Server's output(s).

 Press the left hand action button on the font panel corresponding to the Out label on the LCD display.

The following screen is displayed:




- 1. Indicates the current playback status.
- 2. Title of the track currently playing.
- 3. Name of the audio output currently selected.
- The name of the artist associated with the track currently playing.
- Press this button to change the audio output currently selected.
- 6. Press this button to toggle the Repeat function.
- 7. Press this button to toggle the **Shuffle** function.

#### To Browse Albums in the Library

The font panel user interface is also capable of displaying a list of albums present in the **Library** of the Audio Server.

 Press the front panel action button corresponding to the Albums label on the LCD display. The following screen is displayed:



#### To Select an Album for Playback

- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons on the front panel to move through the albums list alphabetically until the name of the album you wish to play is displayed. The artist name is also displayed below each album title.
- Press the Out action button to select the audio output.
- Finally, press the Play action button.


#### Recording or playing a CD

The front panel user interface can be used to control the recording of a CD onto the hard disk of your Audio Server. It can also be used to play a CD directly from the CD tray.

#### To begin recording a CD

- Press the button labelled OPEN/CLOSE on the front panel, insert a CD into the CD tray and press the OPEN/CLOSE button a second time to close the tray.
- Press the front panel action button corresponding to the CD label on the LCD display.

The following screen is displays the album details:



• Press the **Rec** action button.

The recording quality is determined by the CD Record Settings in the Set Up menu.

• Press the **Rec** action button to begin recording.

The LCD display will show the progress of the recording

and indicate when the recording process is complete.

To play a CD directly from the CD Tray

- Press the button labelled OPEN/CLOSE on the front panel, insert a CD into the CD tray and press the OPEN/CLOSE button a second time to close the tray.
- Press the front panel action button corresponding to the CD label on the LCD display.
- Press the Play action button.

#### To configure setup options

The settings available in the **Set Up** menu of the television user interface are also available via the front panel user interface.

 Press the front panel action button corresponding to the Setup label on the LCD display.

The following screen is displayed:

Use the **∧** and **∨** buttons on the front panel to scroll through the following **Set Up** options:

- Network Settings
- Current Ethernet Settings
- Static Ethernet Settings
- Modem Settings
- TV Settings
- User Interface Settings
- System Information
- Software Update Settings
- Remote Back Up Settings
- CD Record Settings
- Media Transfer Settings
- Online Update

Press the **Select** action button on the front panel to enter any of the above sections and configure settings as you would on the television user interface.

Where you are required to enter text, a screen will appear containing letters, numbers and symbols:



- Use the ∧, ∨, < and > buttons on the front panel to scroll down the list selecting characters to enter.
- Use the Select action key on the front panel to select a character.

As you select characters they will appear at the top of the LCD display.

 Press the Ok action key when you have finished entering text.

#### **Online Updates**

The software used in the Audio Server is always being improved by SpeakerCraft and therefore, periodically, updates become available for download. The process is handled automatically and only a few button presses are required to check for and install the latest available updates.

- Use the **∧** and **∨** buttons on the front panel to select the **Online Update** option.
- Ensuring your Internet connection is present, press the **Select** action button.

Follow the prompts to check for and install online updates. When the process is complete, your audio server will automatically restart with the new software installed.

## USING YOUR AUDIO SERVER WITH A HOME COMPUTER

Your Audio Server has a number of advanced features which can be accessed via a computer connected to your home network.

#### THE REMOTE USER INTERFACE

Your Audio Server's television user interface is accessible via a PC running on your home network. This gives you complete control of your Audio Server using a keyboard and mouse as opposed to a remote control. This can help make editing items in the **Library** easier and quicker and also allows you to control your Audio Server from any computer running on your home network.

#### Accessing the Remote User Interface

- Connect your Audio Server to your home network and power it on. If no DHCP address is available, your Audio Server will automatically assign itself an IP address and become accessible on the network.
- Navigate to the Assigned Ethernet Settings screen in the front panel Set Up menu on the Audio Server and note the IP address. If you are using DHCP this address will be in the same range as the other computers on your network; if not, this address will be in the range 169.254.0.1 - 169.254.255.254.
- Next, using a computer on the network, type the IP address or host name of your Audio Server into the address bar of a web browser (eg. http://192.168.0.1 or http://<hostname>). If you are not using DHCP you may need to reconfigure your computer's network settings before you can access the Remote User Interface.

## **Supported Software**

Currently, the operating systems and web browsers supported are as follows:

On the Apple Macintosh:

- Mac OS X 10.4.2
- Safari 2.0.1

On the PC:

- Microsoft Windows XP (Service Pack 2)
- Microsoft Internet Explorer 6.0.2

**Note:** Other operating systems and web browsers, or earlier versions of the above, may not display the Remote User Interface correctly.

#### **Navigating the Remote User Interface**

You will notice that the Remote User Interface is very similar to the television user interface, but for the addition of some buttons. These buttons have been added to allow you to perform actions normally performed with the Audio Server remote control, but using a standard computer mouse.

When you first connect to the Remote User Interface, you will recognize the **Library** screen:



The screens of the Remote User Interface are identical to those of the television user interface but for the following differences:

- The A and V buttons now appear wherever there
  is a list that can scrolled. You can use your mouse
  to press these buttons when you would usually use
  the A and V buttons on the Audio Server remote
  control.
- The functions of the main action keys on your Audio Server remote control, such as 
   ■Menu, 
   ●Options,
   □Library and 
   ■Now Playing have been replaced by buttons on the screen.
- When required to edit or enter text, the Remote
  User Interface will display the text entry screen
  just as the television user interface does. However,
  instead of using the alphanumeric keypad on your
  Audio Server remote control, you can use your
  computer keyboard to enter text.

You will also notice that playback transport controls are available on the right hand side of the **Now Playing** screen:



You can initiate and control playback from the Remote User Interface using these controls.

#### **MEDIA TRANSFER**

In addition to recording directly from the CD tray, it is also possible to transfer music and cover art images to and from your Audio Server, using a computer on your home network. This feature allows you to transfer music files from your Audio Server to a portable device (for example, an Apple® iPod®) to allow you to listen to your music collection while you are away from home.

**Note**: In some countries the copying of material protected by copyright law may require permission of the copyright owners.

#### **Accessing Media Transfer**


The illustration below shows a typical home network set up. Connect your Audio Server to your home network as described in the section entitled **Accessing the Remote User Interface** on the previous page.

#### **Enabling Media Transfer**

- Press the 

   Menu key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys to highlight Set Up and press the √ Select key.
- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys again to highlight Media Transfer Settings and press the √ Select key.

The following screen is displayed:



This setting should be set to **Enabled** by default. However, if necessary, press the **✓ Edit** key and select **Enabled** to activate media transfer. Use the **© Save** key to save this setting.

Provided that your Audio Server is connected correctly it should now be accessible by browsing the network from your computer. Alternatively, open Windows Explorer and type the IP address of your Audio Server into the Address bar (e.g. \\<IP ADDRESS>). When you attempt to access your Audio Server on your home network, you will be asked to enter a username and password. These are as follows:

- Username speakercraft
- Password speakercraft

**Note**: The above username and password are case sensitive.

If you are using a Macintosh computer you can create a new network connection as follows:


- Select Go from the Finder menu and click Connect to Server.
- Click on the Browse button in the Connect to Server window.
- Navigate to your Audio Server on the network and double-click the appropriate icon.
- If your Audio Server does not appear in the browse window return to the Connect to Server window and enter: smb://<WORKGROUP><AUDIOSERVER\_ NAME> (e.g. smb://MSHOME;AUDIOSERVER) into the Server Address box, then click the Connect button

**Note**: Both the Workgroup and Audio Server Name should be in uppercase.

- In the SMB Mount window click the OK button.
- In the SMB/CIFS Filesystem Authentication window enter the username <username> and the password <password> and then click the OK button.

A window showing the contents of the Audio Server hard disk will be displayed.

At the top level of the media transfer directory structure are two folders entitled **MusicShare** and **Import**.



#### **Importing Files to your Audio Server**

 Double click on the folder entitled Import. An empty folder window will be displayed.

#### To Import Music Files

- Navigate to the location of the music files on your computer.
- Use your mouse to select the files you wish to import and drag them into the Import window.

The files will appear briefly in the **Import** window but after a few seconds will disappear. These files should now be accessible in the **Library** of your Audio Server.

**Note**: The currently supported audio file types for import are **WMA** and **MP3** (WMA Lossless and DRM protected files are not supported). Any files of an unsupported type that are dropped into the **Import** folder will not be imported.

#### **To Import Cover Art Files**

- Navigate to the location of the cover art files on your computer.
- Use your mouse to select the files you wish to import and drag them into the Import window.

The files will appear briefly in the **Import** window but after a few seconds will disappear. These files should now be available when selecting cover art for an album in the **Library**.

**Note**: The currently supported image file types are BMP and JPEG. Files will be resized automatically. Any files of an unsupported type that are dropped into the **Import** folder will not be imported.

#### **Exporting Files from your Audio Server**

- Double click on the folder entitled MusicShare. A folder window will be displayed containing a folder for each artist present in the Library of your Audio Server
- Double click on the folder for an artist. A folder window will be displayed containing a folder for each album by the chosen artist present in the Library.
- Double click on the folder for an album. A folder window will be displayed containing all the tracks within the album and JPEG file containing the cover art for the album.

You now have read only access to these files and can drag and drop them to a location on your PC. You are now also able to copy music from your Audio Server directly to your portable player.

# Transferring Music to your Portable Player using iTunes

The iTunes Media Player application is specifically designed to simplify the process of synchronizing your music collection with an iPod portable player. Support for other devices is limited; you should check that your portable player is compatible before using this application. iTunes version 4.6 or later is required.

The **Library** source in iTunes shows all media files stored on the local hard disk as well as media which has been added from other network drives. You can add the music collection from your Audio Server to the **Library** as follows:

- Select the Preferences option. This can be found under the Edit menu on the Windows edition of iTunes and under the iTunes menu on the Macintosh version.
- Select the **Advanced** tab

- Ensure that the option labelled Copy files to iTunes
   Music folder when adding to library is unchecked.
- Click the OK button to confirm any changes.
- Making sure you have Library displayed in iTunes, navigate to your Audio Server on the network.
- Select the music you wish to transfer; you can transfer entire albums, or all the music by a particular artist, by dragging the relevant folder into the iTunes Library and releasing the mouse button. To transfer the entire contents of your Library, drag the folder entitled Albums By Artist into the iTunes Library.

**Note**: the import process may take some time depending on the number of albums and the speed of your computer.

Once the iTunes **Library** source has been updated with the music from your Audio Server you can you can update your iPod as follows:

- Connect your iPod in the normal way.
- Click the Browse button in the top right-hand corner of the iTunes window.
- Drag any item from the Genre, Artist, Album lists onto the iPod icon in the Source area.

The transfer process will begin shortly afterwards.

#### **Updating the iTunes Library**

If you have removed music from your Audio Server or edited the names of any items in the library you will need to update the iTunes **Library** to remove any broken links. To do this, you should first delete all the Audio Server albums from the iTunes **Library** as follows:

- Select the View Options item from the Edit menu.
- Check the Grouping option, then click the OK button to confirm your changes.
- In the iTunes Library click the new Grouping column heading. The tracks located on your Audio Server hard disk will be grouped together using the label <-AUDIOSERVER\_NAME (e.g. <-SpeakerCraft-1234).</li>
- Click on the first track in the list with this grouping label then, holding down the Shift key, click the last track
- Press the Delete key to remove these tracks from the iTunes Library.
- Click Yes to confirm your choice.

Repeat the import process described above to add back the Audio Server information

# Transferring Music to your Portable Player using Windows Media Player

It is also possible to use Windows Media Player to transfer music from your Audio Server to your portable device.

- Firstly, make sure you can navigate to your Audio Server and view the music in your MusicShare folder.
- Display the File drop down menu and select Add to Library, followed by Add Folder. In the Explorer window that appears navigate to your Audio Server on the network and select the music you wish to transfer; you can transfer entire albums, or all the music by a particular artist by selecting the relevant folder and clicking OK. To transfer the entire contents of your Library, select the folder entitled MusicShare.

**Note**: the import process may take some time depending on the number of albums and the speed of your computer. Once your **Media Library** has been updated with the music from your Audio Server you can update your portable player as follows:

- Click the Copy to CD or Device option from the Media Player toolbar.
- Select the Album, Artist, Genre or Playlist you wish to copy from the Items to Copy list.
- Under Items on Device select your portable player.
- Click the Copy button.

The transfer process will begin shortly afterwards.

#### **REMOTE BACK UP AND RESTORE**

In the unlikely even that your Audio Server develops a fault or, for example, should you one day choose to upgrade to a larger hard disk, you have the option to back up the contents of your Audio Server's hard disk to a selected location on your home network and then restore this information at a later date.

In order to use **Remote Back Up and Restore**, it is first necessary to configure the appropriate settings on your Audio Server.

- Press the 

  Menu key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys to highlight Set Up and press the √Select key.
- Use the ∧ and ∨ again keys to highlight Remote Back Up Settings and press the ✓ Select key.

The following screen is displayed:



In the Remote Location field, enter the location on the network to which you wish to back up your Library (e.g. \\192.168.0.1\Share). Enter Username, Password and Domain where appropriate to access your home network.

The **Replace Back Up** option can be set to **True** to overwrite any exisitng back up infomration in the chosen location.

#### Remote Back Up

- Press the 

  Menu key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys to highlight Remote Back Up and Restore and press the √Select key.

The following screen is displayed:



• Press the **J** Back Up key.

#### **Remote Restore**

- Press the 

  Menu key on your Audio Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the A and V keys to highlight Remote Back Up and Restore and press the ✓ Select key.
- Press the **ORestore** key.
- Confirm that you wish to delete all of the exisiting music in your Library by pressing the 

  ✓ Yes key and entering the password ResetMyMusic.

**Note**: When performing a back up, always ensure there is enough space available at the destination for the quantity of media being transferred. In the event that there is not enough hard disk space, the back up will not complete successfully and the partially backed up files should not be used.
